Dr. Workman turned the meeting over to Davenport Financial for a brief presentation and discussion. - Mr. Lewis presented information on VEDP referrals and we seem to be up for the year to date. The report is attached.
- There was discussion on meeting with our legislators later this spring/early summer concerning the tobacco commission revisions for salary consideration in possible economic development projects. They are using new measuring criteria that are based on prevailing wages rather than the past use of 1.5 x minimum wage. No one is arguing against higher salaries, but there was discussion on how this will impact future projects. Mr. Lewis will work on a possible meeting.
